TPA Board make a resolution to the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) to authorize a countywide referendum to create a dedicated source of operating funding to support the 561 Plan with specific emphasis on the northern extension of Tri-Rail (FM# 4170317).

1989 Tri-Rail Began Service



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Project Status

- Funding prioritized for Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study for Tri-Rail to extend commuter rail service from West Palm Beach to Jupiter on the Florida East Coast Railway (FEC).
- PD&E will continue to be delayed until:
 - 1. Local funding source is secured to construct, operate, & maintain service.
 - 2. FEC access fee and easement are granted to construct and operate project within FEC private right-of-way.

Primarily operates in dedicated rail lanes


Bus Rapid Transit (BRT)

Outreach

- Meetings with community organizations and groups to share plans, goals and objectives
- Work with public agencies and private organizations
- Secure agreements and resolutions approving of the transportation plans

Funding Mechanism

- Review funding mechanisms to implements plans, including potential ballot placement
- Private sector to lead effort to secure voter approval for funds



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
