

MICHAEL FITZPATRICK completed his report on electric vehicles and requested the committee's permission to present his findings at the April 6, 2022 CAC meeting.

RICHARD VASSALOTTI mentioned a crash that occurred at Ibis Blvd and Northlake Blvd. He requested an updated briefing on the State Road 7 extension projects.

1.F. CAC Liaison's Report

PAULA RYAN asked about the utilization of the RAISE Grant for West Palm Beach intersections.

UYEN DANG suggested reaching out to West Palm Beach directly about the utilization of the RAISE Grant for intersections in specific neighborhoods. Additionally, she inquired about the proportion of the seven Local Initiatives (LI) applications that would be funded.

2.A. RECOMMENDED ADOPTION of 2022 Legislative and Policy Positions

ANDREW UHLIR, TPA Deputy Director of Programs, provided a PowerPoint presentation that can be viewed at PalmBeachTPA.org/CAC. Andrew stated the draft 2022 legislative and policy positions were consolidated from the TPA and regional long range transportation plans, the TPA's Vision Zero Action Plan, and positions taken from the Florida Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council (MOPAC) and other partner MPOs.

There were no public comments on this item.

Member discussion ensued about dissemination of policy positions to statewide partners, definitions of autonomous, electric, and connected vehicles, and the mechanism for tracking the progress of these policies in the State House and State Senate.

MOTION to approve Amendment #3 to the TPA's FY 22-26 TIP made by Paula Ryan, seconded by Marc Brunner, and carried 8-3 as depicted in the table below.

James Bonfiglio and Michael Fitzpatrick dissented due to concerns with the language in the positions around autonomous vehicles.







Summary Points of the March 17, 2022 Governing Board Meeting

Endorsed a Florida Bicycle Month Proclamation – The Board endorsed a TPA proclamation recognizing March 2022 as Florida Bicycle Month and recognized the other 14 municipal and County entities that adopted their own proclamations.

Received a Florida Bicycle Association Bicycle Friendly Business of the Year Award – The TPA received the 2021 Florida Bicycle Association Bicycle Friendly Business of the Year Award for their efforts and achievements for bicyclists to help shape the vision for bicycling to be safe, accepted and encouraged in Florida.

Approved Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) Appointment – The Board approved Naresh Machavarapu as Representative for the City of Boca Raton through March 2025.

Approved TAC Renewals – The Board approved renewal of Loraine Cargill as Representative and Vicki Gatanis as Alternate for the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA), and Kim DeLaney as Representative for the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) through March 2025.

Approved Transit Unplugged TV Consent and Release Form – The Board approved a media release form for the TPA Interim Executive Director in response to an interview with Transit Unplugged TV on March 4, 2022.

Appointed a Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board (TD LCB) Chair - The Board appointed Vice Mayor Reed as the newest Chair of the TD LCB due to Mayor Grant's term of office expiring. The next TD LCB meeting will be held on May 25 at the TPA's office.

Appointed Representatives for the Southeast Florida Transportation Council (SEFTC) - The Board appointed Mayor Weinroth as the main Delegate and reappointed Commissioner Marino as the Alternate Delegate for the SEFTC Governing Board. The next SEFTC meeting is tentatively scheduled for April 29 in Miami. For more information, visit **SEFTC.org**.

Appointed Representatives for the Florida Metropolitan Planning Organization Advisory Council (MPOAC) Governing Board – The Board appointed Mayor Pinto as the main Representative and appointed Vice Mayor Reed and Commissioner Waldron as Alternate Representatives for the MPOAC Governing Board. Phases occurring within the next 90 days Palm Beach TPA & FDOT District 4

The purpose of this report is to ensure stakeholders are aware of upcoming activities for each project to allow for increased input. The TPA has consolidated the FDOT report to focus on TPA priorities and scheduling activities that are occurring within the next 90 days. The full list of scheduling activities is described below.

| Execution Date (Design) | FDOT Design starts. |
| Project Kickoff Meeting | FDOT Design Team coordinates with local agency. Contact the FDOT project manager for date/time/location of the meeting. |
| Initial Field Review | Field Review meeting. Typically occurs at the project site. |
| Initial Engineering | 30% plans to reviewers. Stakeholders provide review and feedback on the approved Typical Section. |
| Public Information Workshop | FDOT conducts public information workshop. |
| Constructability Plans | 60% plans to reviewers. At this time most of the Design is complete, no scope discussion, review focuses on items to be constructed, their construction impacts, and materials to be used. |
| Plans Specification and Estimates (PSE) Meeting | FDOT PM arranges field review with all reviewers to evaluate the final engineering plans with respect to actual field conditions. |
| Biddability Plans to Reviewers | 90% plans. At this time, Design is complete. Verifying quantities and pay items. |
| Production | 100% plans. Plans are complete. |
| Local Agency Program (LAP) Commitment | Agency and FDOT commits the project funds and budget to the Legislature and the Governor's office. |
| Letting | Bids are opened and the apparent low bid contract is determined. Construction typically begins 4 to 6 months after letting. |
| Construction Notice to Proceed (NTP) | Construction starts. Construction dates for FDOT administered projects can be found through the FDOT Operations Center. |





CBS 12: Indiantown Road Backplates



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently installed retroreflective backplates on 84 signal heads at 11 intersections along Indiantown Road. Backplates help to reduce glare during sunrise and sunset. The Town of Jupiter worked with FDOT to initiate installation after a Fatal Pedestrian-Bicyclist Crash Report from the TPA, presented in May 2021, which reported glare as a potential cause for a crash that killed a bicyclist on Indiantown Road.
