2.B. <u>RECOMMENDED ADOPTION</u> of the TPA's FY 23-27 TIP

JASON PRICE provided a PowerPoint presentation that can be viewed at <u>PalmBeachTPA.org/CAC</u>. This program was developed in collaboration with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and various local agencies and includes transportation projects funded by federal, state, and local sources for all modes of transportation. The program reflects revenue expectations for the next five fiscal years and shows phases and funding sources by year for each project. Jason reviewed key projects from each section of the TIP and noted it was open for public comment until June 16, 2022.
