Guidelines & Scoring System

#### TA Program Overview

- Funds on/off-road and Safe Routes to School
- Sidewalks, bicycle facilities, ped/bicycle signals, lighting, safety
- \$5.1M available, \$1.5M max per project, \$250K minimum

- Program Kick-Off October 20, 2022 (TPA Governing Board Meeting)
- Program Application Workshop November 3, 2022
  - Held at TPA office and recorded live.
- Pre-Application Meeting Required November 7, 2022 January 31, 2023
- Application Deadline February 17, 2023
- VZAC Scoring April 6, 2023
- Draft Priority Projects List to Committees & Board July 2023
- Final Project Priorities to FDOT July 21, 2023


